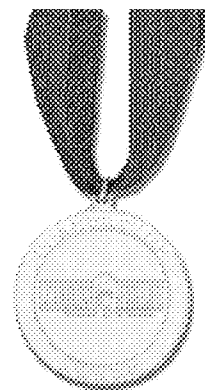

Lemonade

Divide the players into two teams. Have the teams line up at opposite sides of a playing area, which is clearly defined before play begins.

One team is selected to go first. The members secretly choose two things: a place to be from (any city, state, or country) and some action to perform (washing dishes, playing baseball, etc.).

The "acting" team moves to the center of the playing area, and says, "Here we come!" The other team yells, "Where from?" The first team then replies with the place they have chosen. The second team then asks, "What's your trade?" and the first team replies, "Lemonade!"

After the first team says, "Lemonade," they begin to perform the action chosen earlier. The other team must try to identify the activity by yelling out guesses. When someone on the second team calls out the correct guess, a game of tag begins. The first team turns and runs back to their starting line as the second team tries to catch them.

After both sides have had the chance to act out their trade, the team that has tagged the most players can be declared the winning team.
